

## Digital Research And Projects in Ireland

The Digital Humanities Observatory was a research project made up of digital humanities scholars drawn from the disciplines of History, English, and Library Studies. It was chartered by the Higher Education Authority to carry out a census of past research projects in the digital humanities.

The DHO collected information about sources of funding, tools and methods employed and descriptive elements about projects and online access provided by the project and would like to make this information available online to researchers and scholars active in the DH and associated communities.

The staff of the DHO noted that one of the bigger challenges to such censuses is keeping them current and providing for a means to ensure their sustainability over time.

Metadata conformed to an ontology jointly developed with the Humanities and Social Science Network in the UK.

They would like to sustain the availability of their data over the longer term and make it findable, searchable and discoverable by the widest possible audience.
